The Obedience Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

DIRECTIONS TO OBEDIENCE SITE

Chippewa Park, Specialty Headquarters

FROM THUNDER BAY

Take Hwy.61 South to Chippewa Road (soon after you go over the Kaministiquia River). Turn left on Chippewa Road and go approximately 3.5 km (2 mi) to three way stop. Continue straight, now called City Road, for approximately 4 km (2.5 mi) and keep right toward Chippewa Park. Continue another 2 km (1.2 mi) and turn left into Chippewa Park.

OBEDIENCE AWARDS

Rosettes and prizes will be awarded for the following. All prizes must be claimed at the trial, no prizes will be mailed.

High in Trial First to fourth in each class.
All qualifying dogs
FCRSC Perpetual trophy for High in Trial, plus keeper trophy.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Confirmation of receipt of entry will be emailed (or phoned) to you.
Confirmation of start time and order of classes will be confirmed by email after entries have closed. The precincts of the trial will be the obedience ring plus the surrounding 10 feet.

You MAY enter both the obedience trial and the sweepstakes.

Bitches in season CANNOT compete in the Obedience trial.

UNOFFICIAL CLASSES

Dogs entered in Unofficial Classes must also be entered in a Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

VETERANS OBEDIENCE - For dogs that have an Obedience title and are at least 7 years old on the day of the trial. Exercises are as in the Novice Class.

BRACE OBEDIENCE - For any 2 dogs of either sex that has attained not less than a CD title in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person own both dogs. Exercises are as in the Novice Class. Dogs shall be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged as though they were one.

TEAM OBEDIENCE - Open to any 4 dogs of either sex which have attained not less than a CD title in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team. Five dogs may be entered, one to be considered as an alternate, however, the same 4 dogs must compete in all exercises. Exercises are performed simultaneously and judged as for the Novice Class, except that the figure 8 will be performed in the heel free exercise. The stand for exam will be off leash. There will be a drop on recall exercise where the dogs will be called and dropped individually, and then perform the recall and finish simultaneously according to Open.
